I. Content: (Total 20 Points)

- a) Ideas and Examples: (10 Points)
 - Original Ideas related to the topic.
 - Proper examples

b) Progression and Conclusion: (10 points)

- Organized and easy flow of ideas
- Logical progression and transitions of ideas
- Effective conclusion

II. Creativity and Language (10 points)

- · Creativity in presenting ideas and examples
- Appropriate vocabulary
- Expressive language
- Clear pronunciation
- Sense of humor
- Must not use jargon or slang.

III. Confidence, Style, and Effectiveness (10 points)

- Confident delivery
- Eye contact
- Proper use of body language and expressions
- Proper voice modulation
- Fluent presentation

IV. Preparedness (deduction for reading)

- Must not read the speech.
- May glance once or twice at notes written on an index card. Cell phones are not allowed on the podium.
- **Deduction of 5 points** for reading complete sentences.

V. Staying within the time limit (deduction for exceeding the time limit)

First bell: The speaker is permitted to complete the sentence, **no deduction of points**. **Second bell:** The speaker must stop. Continuation of the speech will result in **deduction of 5 points**.

Third bell: The speaker must exit the stage.

Note: Students are free to choose their material from any international sources so long as they are applicable to the topic. Their speeches should not contain any profanity or vulgarity.
